### 86TH ANNUAL MEETING HELD IN MARCH

au Claire Energy Cooperative members, directors, and staff gathered at The Florian Gardens on March 21 for the 86th Annual Meeting. Over 250 member-owners gathered to vote for their directors, honor scholarship recipients, visit educational booths, and have tons of fun! Thank you to our members for making this year's meeting so successful!

Board Chair Clarence Boettcher took the time to introduce many guests including ECEC's Youth Ambassadors, Member Advisory Council, and scholarship recipients. He also awarded the 7th annual Concern for Community Award to long-standing member, Dudley "Joe" Smith. President and CEO Monica Obryki addressed the membership and discussed what the cooperative has done this past year to provide exceptional service to its members and how the cooperative has upheld the seven cooperative principles.

Election Results Outlined in the cooperative's Bylaws, three of ECEC's districts are up for election annually. This year, Districts 1, 5, and 8 were on the ballot. In District 1, Thomas Schwartz (incumbent candidate) was re-elected with 167 votes. Mr. Schwartz ran uncontested. In District 5, Joseph Becker (incumbent candidate) was re-elected with 134 votes. Mr. Becker ran against Charlene "Charlie" Walker, who received 37 votes. In District 8, Jeffrey Frieburg (incumbent candidate) was re-elected with 164 votes. Mr. Frieburg ran uncontested. All elected candidates will serve a three-year





notice will be printed on the May 2023
bill. The notice details each memberowner's total capital credit balance
including 2022's retirement applied
to the October 2022 bill and 2022's
allocation.
