Smart thermostats allow you to adjust your home's temperature

from anywhere and can enable you to program your thermostat to take the guesswork out of it.

For those relying on electric heat, programs like Dual Fuel are designed to help keep homes warm while managing costs. Members receive a lower electricity rate per kWh on their primary heating source on the dual fuel program. The tradeoff? During the coldest days, your primary heating system may be temporarily controlled, but your backup heating system keeps your home comfortable. The change is seamless for you, yet it helps the cooperative reduce the most expensive power purchases and manage system demands.


